COURSE NUMBERING

Because SSA offers so few designated advanced courses, we use an internal numbering system on our transcripts. The course numbering system indicates curricular sequence as follows:

- 100 level Grade 9 or introductory
- 200 level Grade 10
- 300 level Grade 11
- 400 level Grade 12
- 500 level AP or highest level offered

ADVANCED PLACEMENT & HONORS COURSES

SSA does not designate any courses as "honors" because all courses follow a rigorous college preparatory curriculum.

Advanced Placement courses are only offered in three subject areas: math, foreign language, and computer science. Therefore, most SSA students do not take more than two AP courses during their time at SSA.
